## The School and Community

The Vanguard School is an inclusive preparatory boarding and day school dedicated to empowering neurodiverse learners. We specialize in providing an individualized environment for learners to connect to learning, find a community, build confidence, and seek to identify value in themselves and others. We strive to produce adults with the grit and skills to pursue personal interests and goals.

Our school was first established in Pennsylvania as a day school in 1960. In 1966, The Vanguard School began serving students in central Florida and continues to operate as a residential boarding school governed by a Board of Trustees, serving a diverse community of students from 15 states and 15 countries each academic year.

## Academics

The Vanguard School welcomes learners by meeting them at their social/emotional and academic skill level and provides strategy and skill support at their individualized learning pace.

While offering small class size, assistive technology, social pragmatic support, and learning accommodations to all students, success in and out of the classroom is met to increase confidence and connection to academic pursuit.

The Vanguard School follows Florida state standards as all graduates receive a standard academic diploma based on a minimum of 24 credits. Skill-based testing is completed each spring to inform development, reenrollment placement and student plan updates. GPA is weighted based on honors (0.5 quality point) classes, and the GPA is cumulative for grades 9-12.

Core academics include mathematics, reading, science, language arts, and history. Electives include physical education, studio arts, culinary arts, journalism, Spanish, graphics/technology, woodworking, and metals.

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The Dual Enrollment program is an acceleration program that allows high school students to simultaneously earn credit toward high school completion and a career certificate, an associate, or baccalaureate degree at a Florida public institution. Qualifying high school level students can participate in the Dual Enrollment Program at Vanguard's partner Institutions, Polk State College, Webber University, and/or Ridge Technical College. The Vanguard School provides guidance, tutoring, and transportation for these students as they build college credits and applicable experience.
